# Investment Banking re-cap (1 of 2)

- Investment banks advise clients on transactions:
  - M&A Advisory:
    - Acquisitions, mergers, joint ventures
    - Corporate restructurings
    - Recapitalizations, spin-offs, divestitures, leveraged buyouts
    - Takeover defenses, shareholder relations
  - Financing:
    - Originate, structure and execute equity offerings, debt issuances and derivative products
- Boutique firms often focus exclusively on M&A advisory & restructuring
  - Applicants should research each firm prior to the corporate presentation

# Associates re-cap (1 of 2) What do Associates do?

#### Financial analysis and communication

- Build and audit financial models (Merger models, Valuation, LBOs)
- Synthesize key insights and developing recommendations
- Compile PowerPoint decks ("pitch books") and memos
- Conduct research (online, in-person due diligence)

#### Process and stakeholder management

- Act as the internal "quarterback" to ensure all elements of a process are executed correctly and on time
  - Motivate and organize analysts (and project team)
  - Receive requests from senior team members and allocate workstreams accordingly
  - Manage relationships with teams across the firm (e.g., legal, compliance) and externally (e.g., accountants, coadvisors)
  - Communicate with client team members



# Associates re-cap (2 of 2) Why is it a great job for MBAs?

#### Develop 360° management experience

- Managing up and down hierarchies
- Standard of professionalism
- Make a tangible impact
  - On leaders, organizations, and entire industries
  - Newsworthy transactions >\$500m
- Constantly challenge yourself
  - Steep learning curve
  - Dynamic, interconnected industry
- Build a world-class network
  - Engaging with high-level decision makers
  - Intelligent and driven peers



## What makes a good Associate?

- Genuine interest in Investment Banking
- Attention to detail
- Strong communication skills
- Ability to manage up and manage down
- Organized and structured
- Project management
- Judgement to prioritize competing deliverables
- Intellectual curiosity and willingness to learn
- Enthusiasm to help a client
- Work ethic
- Comfort with quantitative and qualitative analysis

**MD:** "Can you get started on the analysis this morning? Tx"

**Analyst:** "I'm stuck in Philly airport with my computer in checked baggage, apologies won't be able to get to it until this afternoon."

**MD (15 mins later):** "How's the analysis coming along? Any questions? Tx"

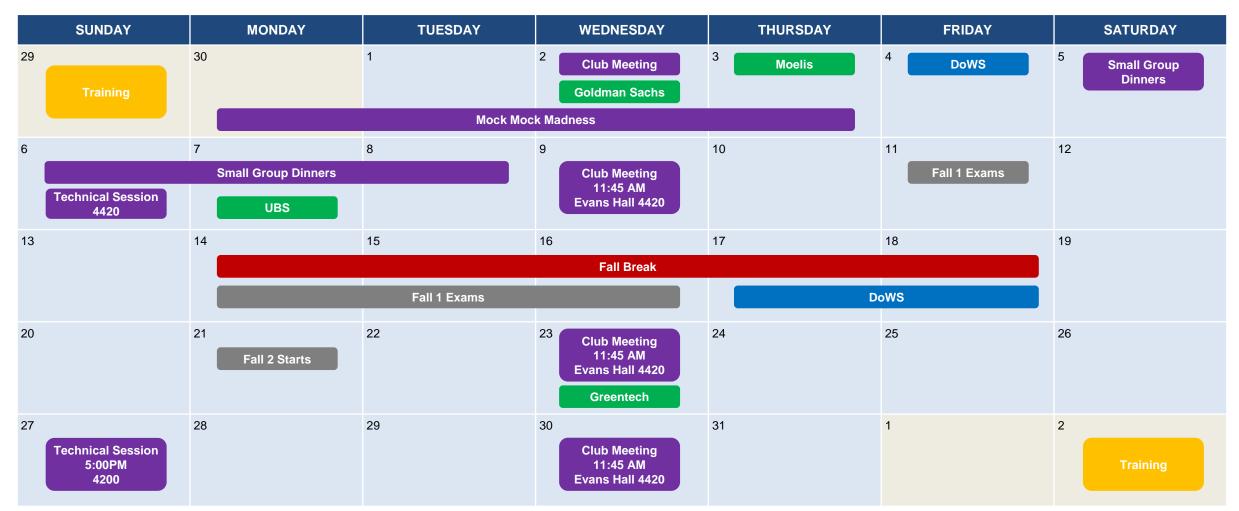

  - Balancing commitments

## Email Example: Post-Coffee Chat

#### Good example

Banker (or 2<sup>nd</sup> year student),

I just want to thank you again for meeting with me this morning. I enjoyed hearing more about what led you to BANK and how your focus on Industrials only came about after you began this process yourself. I also liked learning about the staffing process and how it leads to a diverse set of projects in a short amount of time.

I hope to see you at THE EVENT next Monday and look forward to the remaining recruitment process.

### **General Communication Guidelines**

- Carefully check emails (names, banks, dates) before sending be extremely cautious with copy/pasting!
- Prompt responses
  - This is a requirement for the associate role, so demonstrating an ability for concise and timely communication during the recruiting process is key
  - Respond ASAP, at most within 24 hours (but within the hours of 9.00am-6.00pm/7.00pm and not on weekends)
- Whenever possible, respond from a laptop to avoid spelling errors/mistakes when responding on a mobile device
  - Ensure your mobile signature is configured in case you do need to respond from your phone
- Make it personal and thoughtful
  - Try to include a key takeaway or topic from your discussion in your follow-up note



## Your Story

- Craft your story with an eye to the associate role
  - Corporate Events : ~30-second "elevator pitch"
  - Informational Interviews : ~2-minute story
- Story should be concise, cohesive and tailored to the Investment Banking Associate role
  - Education, past work experience (highlight related skills), why you came back to school, why banking
- Be prepared to answer questions
  - Why did you choose Yale SOM?
  - Why do you want to work at X firm?
  - How did your past experience prepare you for this role?

## Do not underestimate body language

- Practice smiling
- Pay attention to posture
- Use **power poses**
- Use engaged body language
- Remember your arms and legs
- Have a strong handshake
- Dress for confidence
- Do not fidget
